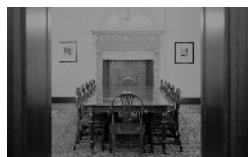

#### **CATHEDRAL WINDOW CONSECRATION AT COLOGNE'S HIGH CATHEDRAL**

More than 450 employees accepted the invitation from the Bank's partners to attend a special religious service followed by a consecration of a reconstructed 19<sup>th</sup> century cathedral window. The window, which depicts scenes from the apocalypse, was designed on the basis of original plans by the Viennese historical painter Johannes Klein.
